icki Cannon of Modesto expects good things to happen; she's

always considered herself a "lucky person." But she was shocked when SHE RURRED **OFF \$77,000 WORTH** OF WINNINGS FROM A "RED HOT & BLUE 7'S." SCRATCHERS TICKET on June 19. 2004.

"When I first scratched the ticket I thought, 'this can't be possible."" said Cannon. "I kept looking at it. I was in the house by myself, sitting at the kitchen table. and I was shocked and could not believe it. My husband and son were

Cannon, 50, plays the lottery sporadi-

cally, but, "I usually send my son in to buy lottery tickets when we stop at the AM/PM on Tully Road (in Modesto)." Cannon said her son is due for "something real nice." A Modesto native, Vicki has plenty of family around to share her winning joy. Besides Ron, a 53-year-old carpenter. Cannon has her children. Justin, 30, and daughter Devon, 26, her mother, two sisters, and grandchildren.

Helpina her grandchildren will be a priority for the winnings, but Cannon said there are no purchases planned.

"We might eventually buy a new car or take a trip when I take my vacation time. said Cannon, She works at the Del Monte Cannery as a quality assurance specialist. "My co-workers

and family were real excited about my run of good luck. My son made

copies of the winning ticket, just to show to friends. When I went to Raley's Supermarket, they were showing the ticket to customers. It was fun." (\$)

eorgia Lopez, a U.S. Postal Service clerk from Whittier, delivered in the clutch, and won \$225,000 on a "Big Spin" episode in October 2004. About the win, she said. "I was excited. Out of breath, I could not even talk to the announcer. I did not expect to win when I went on the show." After surviving two elimination

rounds. Lopez made it to the big wheel. HER FIRST SPIN GAVE HER A "TRIPLE:" THEN SHE LANDED ON THE \$75,000 SLOT, FOR A \$225,000 TOTAL.

Her run of good luck began when "I was driving to see my mother in Utah," said Lopez, "and I stopped at a store in Baker (right before the Nevada border) to buy three "Big Spin" Scratchers. One of them had three "TV Shows" on it." She was so excited about the prospect of winning a minimum of \$1,750 on the show she called her husband. Gilbert. He and children Christina and Marc. grandchildren Jasmine and Joey, and other family members attended "The Big Spin" show as a cheering section.

Lopez will put the money to good use. "I have been debating whether to invest it or pay off the house. Paying off the house is the best," she said, "It's not enough to retire on, but things have been changing in my life for the better. I was on the graveyard shift, and I just got a day job. Change Agents

Retailers' promotional efforts lead to increased weekly lottery sales.

he California Lottery's Retailer of the Month award for November 2004 was awarded to George and Margarita Garcia of Frank's Liquor in Anaheim. The couple bought the store last year with partner Alvin Quiambao.

The three agents immediately began an aggressive promotional campaign, using "posters, winner lists, and friendly service" to increase interest in California lottery games.

FRANK'S LIQUOR HAS ALWAYS BEEN A GOOD **OUTLET FOR CALIFORNIA LOTTERY TICKETS,** AVERAGING \$6,000 A WEEK IN SALES. But, after George Garcia bought the store, he thought he could do even better. What was his plan? Garcia made some changes in how lottery games were presented, including an In-counter, and added to the lottery literature already displayed in the store.

The lottery clientele at Frank's Liquor

responded well to the changes. Add to that the Garcia family's commitment to their customers. "We are happy to see our customers win," said Margarita. "Sometimes we even help them check to see if they have won, and then help them with the forms for claiming winnings."

Margarita Garcia said the store is a family commitment with son Jocent, 19, and daughter Joby, 17, pitching in to help. What's their experience in the business? The family knows how to market the lottery because George Garcia had managed Frank's Liquor for many years before buying it.

The Garcias emmigrated to America from the Philippines two years after their marriage in 1983. (\$)



Prop 98 Author Receives Award

Former state education secretary honored on "The Big Spin."

ssemblywoman Carol Liu presented an EXCEPTIONAL EDUCATOR AWARD TO JOHN MOCKLER. THE AUTHOR OF **CALIFORNIA'S PROPOSITION 98.** a law that guarantees a minimum level of funding for K-12 schools and community colleges, during an October 2004 edition of "The Big Spin."

Sacramento Consultant JOHN MOCKLER was proud to accept an Exceptional **Educator award from the California Lottery.**

Mockler, a past Secretary of Education and Executive Director for the State Board of Education, also worked on education policy during his tenure as a legislative and agency staff person. "As my children say, I am formerly everything," said the 63-year-old Sacramentobased education consultant (John Mockler & Associates), "If it's in education. I've been around it somewhere. I've either been part of the problem, or part of the solution," he laughed.

Mockler grew up in San Diego County. with degrees from the University of California, Santa Barbara and California State University, Sacramento, He gained a graduate degree in economics before working for Superintendent of Instruction Wilson Riles, "But, I was never smart enough to be a teacher." His children Robert and Jessica work in Los Angeles as an attorney and teacher respectively.

In 1997, an education coalition asked Mockler to write the Proposition 98 ballot initiative in response to the continuous series of reductions in public school funding in California. "I wanted to help make sure that education would always be a top priority," said Mockler. \$

Prelude to Foundation

Lotteries helped build roads, bridges, and schools in Colonial America...and helped fund the Revolutionary War. By Tom Direnzo

rom the earliest days America's colonization, the use of the lottery was a significant tool used to fund the fundamental needs of a fledging society. In the Third Charter of (Jamestown) Virginia (1611) the English

Crown set up the ground rules for lottery operations during the colonial period: "We do further, for Us, our Heirs, and Successors . . . GIVE and GRANT, full Power and Authority, free Leave, Liberty, and License, to set forth, erect, and


> publish, one or more Lottery or Lotteries, to continue and be further kept, during our Will and Pleasure only, and not otherwise "

While lotteries had been well established in Asia and Europe, lottery activity for America's benefit would later become a subject that raised anast and anxiety on both sides of the Atlantic.

In colonial America, lotteries funded a variety of things: roads, schools (in particular. Universities like Yale, Harvard, Princeton, and Columbia) bridges, factories, mills, and meeting houses.

For the most part these lotteries were preapproved by the British government. By the 1760's, however, the British government was growing tired of indepen-

dent tendencies of the American colonies. The prevailing attitude in England's was that the colonies should become revenue providers rather than merely outlets for goods. By the mid-1700s, financial controls were tightened and the corresponding attitude toward the British by the self-sufficient, independent-minded colonists became decidedly hardened.

The Stamp Act, passed by Parliament without debate in 1765, intended to raise funds to help pay the cost of keeping the (British) military deployed in the colonies. Not only was the Stamp Act hated and generally ignored, it allowed for the growth of nationalistic sentiment among the colonists and is considered a flash point for the American Revolution.

On a smaller scale, so too did the atti-


tude of the British about lotteries in America. Tired of requests from the colonies, the Lords of Trade (in 1768) termed lotteries, "a practice . . . obviously tending to disengage and mislead Adventurers from Industry and Attention."

Eight years later, after Washington's defeat at New York City and desperate for monies to fight the revolution, the (American) Board of Treasury approved a lottery to raise \$1,000,000 to fund troops and further the cause of American independence.

From funding the development of a new land to the colonists fighting against the founder, lottery activity had come full circle. Now lotteries would be used instead of increased taxes to help build the new nation.

Joined on stage by a large and raucous group of celebrating family and friends -Herbert has six kids and eleven grandkids - he kept repeating to anyone who would listen: "I don't believe this. This is unbelievable. Incredible, I'm 70 years old. What a time to hit it."

Herbert's son Michael, all smiles, said. "Just to win the chance to be here on 'The Bia Spin.' then get through the Aces High round and win your way to the wheel is a great accomplishment. That's awesome. It is incredible to see your dad up there, winning such a large amount of money. After all he's gone through in the past few months. I don't think anvone deserves this more than he does.

"Oh my God, we were loud," continued Michael. "Every move he made, we screamed and clapped for him. But it was only about half the family here. Good thing the rest of us didn't come. There wouldn't be enough room in the studio."

When Herbert first found out he was on the show, his kids told him to "relax and have a good time," said Michael.

Theodore believed in himself, and amaz-






